

What are the Kiwanis Dues?

The initial dues for the first year for a new member are \$100. The dues after the first year are \$125, which cover:

International Dues	\$77.00
• General Dues:	\$52.00
• Insurance:	\$17.00
• Kiwanis Magazine:	\$ 8.00
District Dues:	\$43.00
Club Dues:	\$5.00
Total Dues	\$125.00

Kiwanis Information

Objectives of Kiwanis

- To give primacy to the human and spiritual rather than to the material values of life.
- To encourage the daily living of the Golden Rule in all human relationships.
- To promote the adoption and the application of higher social, business, and professional standards.
- To develop, by precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive, and serviceable citizenship.
- To provide, through Kiwanis clubs, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to form better communities.
- To cooperate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which makes possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism, and goodwill.

Brief History of Kiwanis

- The first Kiwanis Club was founded in Detroit, Michigan, in 1915.
- In 1916 Kiwanis moved into Canada, and in 1962 Kiwanis moved into Mexico breaking its longstanding tradition of serving only the United States and Canada.
- In 1920, the Kiwanis motto “We Build” was adopted. In 2005, the motto was changed to “Serving the Children of the World.”
- In 1925 the first Key Club was formed, in 1975 the first Builders Club was formed, and in 1998 the first K-Kids Club was formed.
- In July of 1987, Kiwanis voted to accept women in Kiwanis Clubs.
- Today, there are almost 600,000 Kiwanis family members in more than 80 country and geographic areas.
- The Redmond Kiwanis Club was formed on January 14, 1976.
